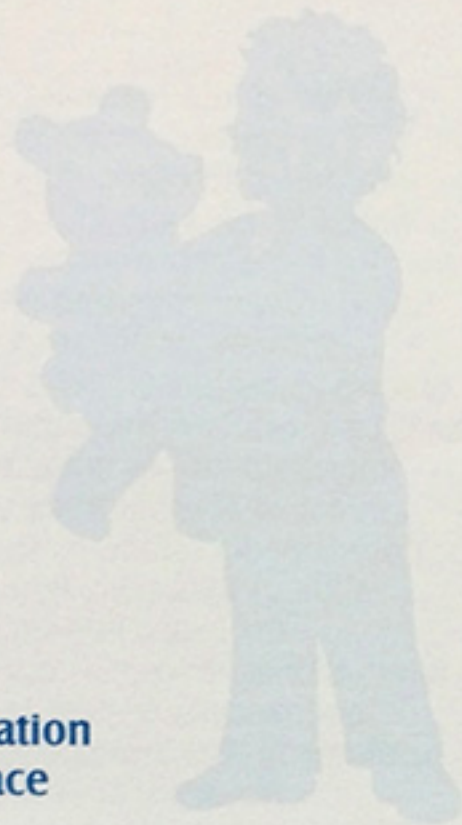

# KEYNOTE SPEAKERS



**Kaisa SAVOLAINEN**  
**Director,**  
**Department of Education**  
**for a Culture of Peace**

Ms K. Savolainen, born 18 December 1940 in Nilsjä, Finland; Director in the Education Sector, UNESCO (Paris) since 1986; presently Director of the Department of Education for a Culture of Peace;

Background in Finland: M.A., University of Jyväskylä, Finland, 1964 (psychology, special education, pedagogy, sociology); psychologist in the vocational counselling (1963-1967) and teacher of psychology on a part-time basis in different vocational education institutes; Information Secretary, the Finnish United Nations Association (1967-1971); Secretary-General, the Finnish Association of Adult Education Organizations (1971-1973); Chief Inspector, National Board of General Education (1973-1979); Assistant Director, Division of Educational Material and Equipment, National Board of Technical and Vocational Education (1979-1986); several positions and memberships in several committees and advisory boards in the field of education, including inter-alia President of the Education Sub-committee of the Finnish National Commission for UNESCO (1975-1986); Member of the Consultative Committee for Education of the Nordic Council of Ministers (1982-1986); author of numerous articles and radio programmes.

Member of the Council of Senior Advisors of the International Association of University Presidents since September 11, 1992.

**David BOADELLA**  
**Director, International Institute**  
**for Biosynthesis**

Founder of Biosynthesis, a somatic psychotherapy. Founder and international editor of *Energy & Character*, the journal of biosynthesis. Co-director with his wife Silvia, of the International Institute for Biosynthesis, in Switzerland. First President of the European Association of Body Psychotherapy, in Geneva. Chairman of the Scientific Committee of the European Association for Psychotherapy, Member of the World Council for Psychotherapy. Formerly director of abbotsbury School in Dorset, and of the Institute for the Development of Human Potential in London. Author of ten books including

"Lifestreams: an introduction to Biosynthesis.

**Speech by David Boadella: The nature of movement and the movement of nature within the child.**

A child is movement born, not still-born. Movement provides the first language of communication, the ground of words. Infant research and body psychotherapy research demonstrate that the child is born with a repertoire of "motoric fields" of expression, which provide the bases for healthy interpersonal communication and emotional experiencing. These motoric fields function as "affecto-motoric schemas" which require appropriate attunement from those who bring the child up. Where traumatic conditions prevail, the research shows that the unexpressed movement patterns remain as potentials for health, which can be activated by appropriate therapeutic or educational environment, even years later.

**Rubens RICUPERO**  
**Secretary-General, UNCTAD**

Mr. Ricupero was appointed as Brazilian Minister of Environment and Amazonian Affairs, 1993. Minister of Finance in 1994.

Director of the Department of North, Central and South America, Ministry of Foreign Relations (1981-1985); Ambassador, Permanent Representative to the United Nations in Geneva (1987-1991); Ambassador to the United States of America (1991-1993); Ambassador of Brazil to Italy (1995). His positions in GATT from 1989-91 included: Chairman and Spokesman of the GATT Informal Group of Developing Countries, Chairman of the GATT Committee on Trade and Development, Chairman of the GATT Council of Representatives and Chairman of the GATT Contracting Parties.

Other international positions included: Head of the Brazilian delegation to the United Nations Human Rights Commission, Geneva, Head of the Brazilian delegation to the Conference on Disarmament; Chairman of the Finances Committee at the United Nations Conference on Environment and Development, Rio de Janeiro, 1992; and Governor for Brazil at the World Bank, the International Monetary Fund and the African Development Bank.

Mr. Ricupero was Professor of Theory of International Relations, University of Brasilia from 1979 to 1995; and Professor of History of Brazilian Diplomatic Relations, at the Rio Branco Institute from 1980 to 1995. He is also the author of several books and essays on international relations, problems of economic development, and international trade and diplomatic history.

Considered the foremost exponent of systems philosophy, general evolution theory, and the integration and interpretation of the new sciences, Ervin Laszlo is likewise noted for his work in the futures and management fields.

He has a PhD from the Sorbonne and is the recipient of four honorary PhDs and other prizes and awards. Formerly Professor of Philosophy, Systems Science, and Futures Studies in various universities in the US, Europe, and the Far East, Laszlo is the author or co-author of thirty-six books translated into as many as seventeen languages, and the editor of another thirty volumes including a four-volume encyclopedia. Currently he is Founder and President of The Club of Budapest, Founder and Director of the General Evolution Research Group, Science Director of the International Peace University of Berlin, Administrator of the Interdisciplinary University of Paris, Fellow of the World Academy of Arts and Sciences, Member of the International Academy of Philosophy of Science, Senator of the International Medici Academy, Editor of the quarterly *World Futures: The Journal of General Evolution*, and Series Editor of *General Evolution Studies* and other book series in Germany and in China.
